Stream Fishing Etiquette

A true fisherman goes fishing not only to catch fish but also to enjoy nature gift of clear sweet water, the forest, and all the creatures that live in them.

He thinks of the other fellow who wants to catch fish as much as he does by:

- 1. Letting the fisherman who arrives at the pool first to finish it without interference.
- 2. Sharing the water. After a reasonable time on a pool he can either have the waiting person join him; tell him to pass through and fish below; or vacate the pool entirely in favor of the other fisherman.
- 3. Allowing the fellow fisherman room to fish so that his cast and drift are not interfered with and the fish are not disturbed.
- 4. Giving room to another fisherman who hooks a fish near him.

A true fisherman practices catch and release in order to conserve the fishery.

Stew Stewart will conduct a class on tying one of the most effective Steelhead Flies developed in the last few years - "Otter Soft Milking Egg and Egg Veil". These flies are soft enough to prevent the Steelhead from immediately ejecting them and therefore increase the time the fisherperson has to strike. More strike time means more hookups and maybe more fish landed. Stew met and spoke with Walt Mueller Jr. - "The Otter" - who is owner of Blue River Designs LLC and manufacturer of Otter's Soft Milking Eggs and Egg Veil. Stew obtained a CD by Walt and is presenting this class on September 1, 2009. Earlier this month an e-mail was sent to all the tiers as Stew had to order the Soft Milking Eggs and the threads. If you didn't submit an order and would like to attend, please call Stew at 474-5748 in the evening for details.

- Thread: Danville 6/0 to match Flamingo, Apricot, and Tangerine Otter Soft Milking Eggs
- Body: Otter Soft Milking Eggs in 6mm and 10 mm in above colors In Opaque, Glow, and Fluorescent
- Veil: Otter's Egg Veil, White

Fly Fishing Lake Almanor

This month we are extremely pleased to have noted fly angler **Hal Janssen** speak about how to effectively fly fish Lake Almanor. Hal is a nationally known writer, artist, lecturer, and video personality. He has been fly fishing for over 50 years and has fished extensively throughout Northern, Central, and South America for nearly every species of fresh and salt water fish.

As a consummate stillwater authority, who fishes all waters, Hal has fished with notables like Joe DiMaggio, Ted Williams, Phil Harris, Bill Rigney, Joe Brooks, Ted Trueblood, John Goddard, Russ Chatham, Gary Howell, Ernie Schwiebert, and George Harvey. His presentation will highlight the fly fishing techniques he has developed over the years to effectively fish Lake Almanor, something he has done for over three decades, as well as other stillwater fisheries.

The September meeting will begin 30 minutes earlier at 6:30 PM when Hal will demonstrate how he ties a number of his favorite stillwater fly patterns during the first hour. His program on fly fishing Lake Almanor will follow the tying demonstration, followed by the regular business meeting.
