Time: Early enough to carpool, coffee, etc. **8:30 AM PROMPT departure**. We will caravan to the lake.

Jerry and Earl will lead the caravan; the Fishmaster will meet you at the lake.

Equipment: 4-6 wt rod, floating line, 4-5 X leader and/or intermediate full sink line.

Flies: Your usual lake midges (in black) and nymphs in small sizes will work as will bugger and leach patterns size 6-12,

BWO size 18, ParaAdams size 16-20. Please check with THE FLY SHOP for the latest hatch data.

Special Equipment: Float tubes, prams (no gas motors, elect. ok), pontoon boats, waders and foul weather gear.

Bank fishing is difficult because of the mud and ice, but doable.

Lakeshore crash course on how to catchem will be presented by a local expert.

The Coffee and Doughnut bar will be open at the lake shore.

Lunch: Hot chili and cornbread will be served from 1:00 to 1:30. Please bring your own drinks.

#### **Broken Lines**

#### Happy New Year fellow clubbers and may all your steelhead be bright.

As a fairly new club member (1 year) and your new Conservation Director, I wanted to give you a little history of my background. I grew up principally in Palo Alto and thanks to the good sense of my great grandfather who homesteaded in Calaveras County; I was trout fishing at the age of 3. In 1968 I took my first excursion to the Klamath to fish for the fabled steelhead. I managed to catch a few half pounders and the sickness took hold.

I went on to Humboldt State where I majored in Natural Resource Management, with a lot of fisheries and wildlife course work. In my summers, I worked with the California F&G Marine Fisheries branch in Menlo Park. I worked principally on DDT research which at the time was a highly sensitive subject. After college, I spent a half a year with the Peace Corps in Nepal, working with the farmers on raising carp. Back home, I eventually got into water and air pollution testing and regulation up until my retirement last year.

The past 20 years I have been active in the Kern River Fly Fishers club, serving as vice-president and conducting workshops on introduction to fly fishing, fly tying, and rod building.

In the next few weeks I plan to meet with the local Fish & Game staff concerning next year's conservation programs. Thanks to Earl Johnson and his crew we have the Trout in the Classroom tanks ready for eggs at Castle, Manzanita and Anderson Heights elementary schools. These programs serve an important function in teaching youngsters about the life history of trout and salmon and what they need to thrive.

So, look to the next newsletter for information on the upcoming conservation programs and "opportunities" for members to lend a hand.

### Lower Sac – Fishout Tuesday Feb. 9, 2010 – alt. Thursday 18th

Fishmaster – Craig Nielson

**Meeting Time and Place**: Posse Ground picnic tables just upstream from the Sundial Bridge at 8:30a.m. Additional information will be announced at the January 13th meeting.

Please remember to purchase your 2010 Fishing License.

**Fishing Location**: Lower Sacramento River, upper reaches (depending on river conditions).

**Equipment/Tackle**: Most folk's rod preference is a 6 or 7 wt. Tippet sizes from 3X to 4X. Sometimes tippet down to 5X for really low, clear water or dry flies. Many use Fluorocarbon tippet for clear water conditions. Plan on bringing your favorite indicator and 3X tapered leaders or 12lb Fluorocarbon to build a nymphing leader.

**Angling Methods**: With winter conditions and hopefully reasonably low flows, the most productive method will likely be nymph fishing under indicators.

The indicator set-up is the same as is used on the Trinity or Klamath Rivers, with about 4 to 7 feet between the indicator and split shot knot, followed by 12-14 inches of 3X tippet to the first fly, in turn followed by 12-14 inches of 4X tippet to the second fly.

Some angler's tie-in the leader to the indicator and/or use a level tippet, say 12lb Fluorocarbon tippet, down to the split shot knot. I prefer to attach the indicator to a tapered leader, so that it can easily be adjusted up or down and can be removed if I want to "high stick" nymph without an indicator, or switch quickly to dry fly fish.

**Flies**: #10-12 egg patterns (shrimp pink or orange for colored water and darker conditions to champagne for clearer water and lighter conditions), Alevin patterns #8-12, #6-8 Superfloss Rubberlegs, #12-14 copper johns (copper, chartreuse and red), and #14-18 flashback PTs, Micromays and other favorite BWO nymph patterns.

Toss in a few midges such as Zebras and Crystal midges #16-20. I always keep a few caddis patterns such as tan Fox Pupas or Birdsnests in the box for those sunny warm afternoons when they sometimes pop. For dries, bring your favorite BWO dries and emergers and keep your fingers crossed.
