#### STFF Mission Statement

- (a) To advance, promote, and teach the art and science of fly fishing by presenting educational programs and by teaching the techniques and ethics of fly fishing and the practice of "catch and" release"; and to teach the art of tying and constructing artificial flies;
- (b) To promote conservation of public recreational resources and protection and preservation of the populations of wild fresh water, salt water, and migratory game fish in our streams and lakes;
- (c) To monitor local waters and bring to the attention of the public and governmental agencies issues, which threaten the conservation, and protection of fresh water, salt water, and migratory game fish;
- (d) To-encourage and practice the high standards of sportsmanship associated with fly fishing;
- (e) To support fly fishers' interests in assuring that suitable portions of public waters be reserved for angling with artificial flies only;
- (f) To encourage family and youth participation in activities of the organization and to provide instruction in all phases of fly fishing for children and adults;
- (g) To actively participate in restoration projects by making donations to organizations which are pursuing the activities consistent with the purposes of the club.

As we continue to grow and function as an effective organization, I hope all of our members will evaluate each of our activities against the criteria that are stated in our mission statement.

**Date & Time:** Monday June 14, 2010 7:30 AM

Meeting Place and Directions to Fishing Site: We will leave promptly at 7:30 from the Holiday Market parking lot, Palo Cedro. From Holiday market, go east on Hwy 44 to Bogard Rest Area / USFS Work Center. This is a little less than 1 ½ hrs. We'll take a break with coffee and donuts at the rest area and re-group before we head to the lake (across the highway). 7 miles of good gravel road takes you to the lake.

Targeted Species: Rainbow trout

Wading, Floating, or Both: Both wading and floating

Watercraft: Optional - Boat Motors Not Allowed

**Lunch:** Lunch will be provided

Recommended Gear

Outfit Size: 4-6 Weight Rods

**Line:** Floating, Intermediate, Sinktip

**Leaders:** 5x-7x; 7-12 foot for dries, 4-7 foot for wet flies

Flies: Stillwater patterns: Midges, Glen Pudwill's "B" fly, Copper Johns, Pheasant Tails, Woolly

Buggers, Dark Lords, Parachute Adams, Adams, Griffiths Gnats, Mosquitoes.

Additional Information: These trout are mostly 7-12 inches and hungry! Floating, sink-tip, and intermediate

lines all work well. Parking at the lake is VERY limited, so carpooling is recommended.

#### ANNUAL LAKE ALMANOR FISHOUT

Fri to Sun, June 25 - 27, 2010

**Fishmaster:** Dale Huffman - 221-4988 - <u>dalesfishing@sbcglobal.net</u>

**Time:** It's time for the Hexagenia to be stirring the spirit of fisherman (and fisherwomen) as well as

the Lake Almanor trout and smallmouth bass to key in on the muddy bottom areas of the lake.

**Meeting Place:** We will be staying at the Almanor South campgrounds (US forest service).

#### **Directions:**

o From Redding go south on I-5 to Red Bluff

- o Take the Antelope exit and turn left (east)
- o Just before you drive out of Red Bluff turn left on Hwy 36 toward Chester
- o Turn south on Hwy 89 just before you enter Chester
- Drive approx. 7 mi. and turn left on Almanor Dr.
   (there is a rest area on the right of Hwy 89 across from the turn)
- o The road curves to the right, the campground will be on your right (if you go down the hill to the lake you missed the turn). Do not turn onto West Almanor Dr., it's the road just before Almanor Dr. and a pain to get turned around on.

**Targeted Species:** Trout and Bass

**Recommended Gear:** Five wt. Rods and higher are advised due to the size of the fish. The fish do not seem

to be too leader shy when the hatch is on, so heavy leaders can be used.

**Flies and Angling method:** To match the hatch; there are several types of Hex dries and nymphs. Other flies like wooly buggers and leech patters may also be effective. Some type of boat, float tube or raft is useful due to limited shore fishing. The Hex hatch is usually the heaviest from around 7:00 P.M. until dark. Hexagenia live in tunnels in the muddy bottom making these areas the preferred fishing spots.

**Fishmaster's note:** A roster of some kind will be placed on the bulletin board on the right side as you enter the campgrounds. Please put your name, campsite number and number of persons in your party when you get the time.

There will be a potluck on Saturday evening prior to going fishing, so bring your favorite dish and join the fun. Most evenings have a short get-together after fishing to swap fishing stories (lies) and socialize.

We had a total of twenty-six on the Fishout. Most of the group either hooked and or landed fish, some small and some large.

The committee had the tough task of picking from 17 excellent applications with well written essays on why the applicant wanted to go to Fish Camp and why they are interested in fly fishing. The following are excerpts from some of the essays:

#### From Will Asnicar, an 11 year old boy from Redding:

"I want to go to Fish Camp because I love the outdoors.... I have never fly fished before and I would love to learn. Fly fishing sounds challenging and I always like a good challenge! ... It seems like something I could do my whole life. I really hope I get an opportunity to learn something new and meet new people."

#### From Dakota Archibald, a 14 year old boy from Redding:

"I love to fish... fly fishing is more of a fight than just a regular rod and reel. When you are reeling a fish in on a fly rod, you can feel every single move the fish has, you can feel everywhere the fish goes.... I have volunteered at Kids Fishing Days at the Mt. Shasta fish hatchery because I love to teach kids how to fish and watching young kids catch their first fish. I would love to go to fish camp this summer to perfect my fly fishing skills. I know this is an opportunity of a life time and I would love to get to be able to go."

#### From Meagan Briggs, a 10 year old girl from Redding:

"Fly fishing interests me very much. I love to fish, and also hunt.... I believe that when you fish or fly fish, you connect with nature and the outdoors. I think if I went to fish camp.... I would be hardworking and helpful, for when I try, I do my best. I will do what needs to be done, no matter what the circumstances are, and try to give it all I've got."

#### From Eric Fernandes, a 13 year old boy from Yreka:

"There is nothing I would rather do than fish. Fly fishing isn't just about catching the biggest fish; it is about meeting all of the people and seeing all of the places. I believe it is both an art and a skill..... I also enjoy tying flies as much as I do fishing them. If I am not doing homework or chores, I am usually sitting trying flies or reading magazines to get ideas for new fly patterns..... Thank you for this opportunity."

#### From Garret Beedle, a 12 year old boy from Redding:



"I would like to go to Fish Camp this summer because I would like to learn how to fly fish... After using spinning rods for a long time, learning fly fishing is a new thing for me. I believe that this camp will help me and give me a chance to experience one of the most fascinating types of fishing ever."

#### From Alex Hendrix, an 11 year old boy from Redding:



"...I admire fly fishing because I think it is more challenging than normal spinning rods. I think it is really exciting when you get a large fish on and your adrenalin builds up.... When I do go out to fish, my pole always gets snagged in the rocks or in trees, and I want to learn how to prevent those mistakes. When I do come back from Fish Camp, I want to teach my family how to fly fish correctly."
