Striped Bass Fishing in Northern California

This month we are pleased to have booked California native **Tony Buzolich** who will give a presentation on striped bass fishing in Northern California. Tony lives and breaths to fish striped bass and fishes for this species as much as he can. He mainly haunts the Sacramento, Feather, and American Rivers as well as the Sacramento / San Joaquin Delta for this outstanding game fish and indicates there is always fish somewhere in this system that will take a well presented fly.

Tony grew up in Sacramento and currently resides in Yuba City and is a member of the E. C. Powell Fly Fishers.

This program is a must program to hear for anyone interested in striper fishing or planning to attend our striped bass outing, November $4-6^{th}$, in the Sacramento / San Joaquin Delta.

Tony will give a tying demonstration beginning at 6:15 PM, which will feature a number of his bait fish patterns tied on 3/0 hooks. He will also demonstrate how to properly tie the Homer Rhodes Loop Knot, a must knot for all striped bass fishermen to know.

MANZANITA LAKE FISHOUT – LASSEN PARK

Fishmaster: Allen Slattery 474-5271 or ajeslattery@yahoo.com

Date: Tuesday, October 19, 2010

Meeting Place: Meet at the boat launch area at 9:00 am. Be prepared for any kind of weather; Manzanita

Lake is 6,000 feet in altitude. There is a ten-dollar vehicle fee for entrance to the park unless

you have a senior pass.

Equipment: 4-6 weight rods, floating or intermediate line. 9 to 15 foot leaders to 5X. You can fish the lake

from a float tube, pontoon boat, or pram no motors are allowed.

Flies: Brown Olive Jay Fair wiggle tail, Callebatis Nymphs, Dry Flies sizes 16-18, Damsel Nymphs

size 14, Baby Rainbow Trout streamer size 6, Ants and beetles are always around.

Midges are my go-to flies here. Black Zebra Chironomids size 18-20 and dry adult midges in sizes 18-20; Adams is a good imitation. Fish them with a little weight under an indicator. A two

fly rig seems to work best.

Additional Information: Wading the lake can be productive. Some of the best fishing can be had walking the shore and looking for cruising fish, be stealthy, hide behind a tree, and toss out a beetle or ant pattern. Be aware of the regulations here. They are posted at the picnic area on the east side of the lake. There is no fishing within 150 feet of the various mouths of Manzanita Creek. The creek is located on the east side of the lake to the north of the picnic area behind the bird nesting area.

Lunch: Bring a lunch and drinks for the day.

Coffee and donuts will be available at the boat launch.

September 7, 2010 - Baum Lake Fishout Report

Seven hearty souls met at the My-T-Fine foods parking lot and departed promptly at 7:35 for the lake. Three others who chose not to caravan up joined us at the lake. Attending were **Gary Sweet**, **Jim Kendrick**, **Earl Johnston**, **Jerry Waybright**, **Ken Brynjolfsson**, **Jerry Marks**, **Gary Sharrock**, **Ken Rick**, **Gerald Nelson** and Fishmaster **Alan Jones**.

Upon arriving short work was made of the Coffee & Donuts provided by Mr. Hospitality. Ken Rick noted that a family of otters had invaded the upper portion of the river by the campground, which left the fishing in that area essentially nonexistent. Those unfamiliar with the lake were given a brief orientation and directed to usually productive water. Others set out on their own to apply their wily trade.

The morning was calm and conducive to casting and catching. There was a Black Caddis hatch in progress which lasted most of the morning. Gary Sharrock, who I think arrived before the sun came up, was the big stick with Gerald Nelson coming in a close second. Most of the fish caught were in the 12"-14" class while some smaller ones were also netted. As usual, most of the fish were fooled by small black or brown midges (18-20's) while some succumbed to a peacock birds nest and an olive Jay Fair WTN.

After lunch desert was provided in the form of a Lemon Bundt cake which was a big hit. After lunch the wind arrived and essentially curtailed the fishing activities. Those who chose to give it a try came up empty. All in all it was a fun day with the weather and the fish cooperating, mostly.

September 14, 2010 - Crater Lake Fishout

The weather was fine and cool as **Art Agnew**, **John Gatner**, and myself pulled into the campground at Crater Lake. We located **Gerald Nelson** who had set up camp and had hot coffee and almond horns waiting for us. As we got our gear together and munched our sweets, we could see the fish rising in the lake and all were anxious to get on the water.

John was the first to hook and land a fish and came away with a total of four fish to hand stripping a brown leech pattern. Towards the middle of the day he switched to a small flying ant and was getting strike after strike but the trout were a little too quick and he missed the hook set.

I started out with a parachute Adams and caught three trout in the morning with the pattern having left it in the third fish because of a deep hook set. I switched to a small black, gray and white stimulator and took a fourth fish. After lunch I had a couple bumps on a Pudwill B-fly on a sink tip line But none hooked.

Gerald started out with an Adams to no avail and after discussing with John what he was using switched to a small black leech pattern and came up with six fish before switching over to the same ant pattern that John was using. He landed three trout with it before lunch. After lunch he caught another four using an olive leech pattern and since he was spending the night he only reported on the fish caught up until everyone left.

Art stated that fishing was slow, in the morning, but early on took 2 fish on a soft hackle peacock pattern using a floating line. Art switched over to the Pudwill B-Fly and lost a nice fish to a poorly tied knot. He got a couple more on #18 BWO bringing the morning's catch to somewhere around 6 - 7 fish. Following lunch he fished the rocks above the campground and caught another 6 - 7 fish in just over an hour using an intermediate sinking line and a small #14 golden olive sparsely tied leech pattern.

All in all it was slow starting but a fun day of fishing. We all loved Crater Lake and are looking forward to returning again.

Delta Striped Bass FishOut Sugar Barge Marina - Bethel Island, CA November 4 - 6, 2010

Meet at Sugar Barge Marina Launch Lamp @ 7:30 AM Thursday, November 4th. Daily launch fees are \$10.00. We will be fishing all the fall hot spots, Franks Track, Sherman Island, Big Break, Mildred Island, and a host of other great locations via boat.

Boat rentals are available at the Sugar Barge Marina if you do not have your own boat. If you are bringing a boat there are a few side tie spaces available for over night storage at \$15.00 per day. Contact the Sugar Barge RV Resort to reserve side tie space.

Lodging: Headquarters for this outing will be Sugar Barge Marina and RV Park (Call (925) 684-9075 to make reservations for RV spaces.

Note: This is a very popular time of the year so call ASAP to reserve your RV space.

There are a number of hotels in the area Comfort Suites (925) 755-1222, Hampton Inn (925) 513-1299, and Holiday Inn Express (925) 634- 6400. All these hotels are located 10 – 15 minutes away from Bethel Island. Also, The Sugar Barge has a few rental trailers available which sleep 2+ adults with A/C and TV (bring your own linen and food). Contact Sugar Barge RV Resort for rental information.

Recommended Gear: A powerboat is a necessity and it's recommended there only be two (2) fly anglers per boat (The Sugar Barge Marina also has rental boats available if a boat is needed). Rod and Reels 7 – 11 weight. 9 weight rods set up with a type 4 – 8 Shooting Head is a good choice.

Also, October and November have been known to be good top water months so a floating line setup, Shooting Head or Weight forward, is also in order.

Flies: 2/0 – 4/0 Flashtail Whistlers, Flashtail Clousers white/chartreuse, Sar-Mul-Mac in sardine, anchovy, or mackerel patterns.

Leaders: (Keep them simple) 6 – 9 ft. 20 pound mono leader. Tie a surgeon's knot on one end, attached to fly lines butt section, and use a good loop knot to attach fly.

Extra Stuff: Rain Coat, binoculars, camera, Boga Grip, Sun Screen, Life Jacket, GPS, Delta Nautical Charts, Cell Phone, and Battery Charger to recharge trolling motors, Boat covers just in case it rains.

Dan Blanton's 13th Annual Striperfest is scheduled for Saturday, November 6th and will be again held at the Sugar Barge Marina. Reservations to attend this year's event, an outstanding fund raiser to save our Delta's Striped Bass Fishery, can be made on Dan's website www.danblanton.com.
