

(The new face of STFF Fishouts) The group followed Michael to the banks of the river and watched as he showed how to cast and mend the Lower Sac rigging and areas to look for that should hold fish. After Michael's demo those that were to fish went to areas along the stretch called Lake Redding.

Alan and Sue designated themselves as the outing photographers and came up with some excellent pictures of all of us. Bary stated that the group was loads of fun, though the catching didn't happen, the swimmer seemed to come out of the water ok. Ron positioned himself on some good looking water but stated that he had no grabs even though he saw some spawning salmon. Ron also commented that the swimming must have been cold. Tom found mending line into the wind a bit challenging at times but had a lot of fun even though he did not catch anything. Rich greatly appreciated Michael's presentation and said the fishing was fun but the

Beginners Casting Classes

The Beginners Fly Casting Classes will begin on April 25, 2011. These classes run on 5 Mondays for 2 hours each class. Classes begin at 6 PM and run until about 8 PM each evening. They will be held on the lawn just south of the Redding Convention Center and across from Channel 7 in the Turtle Bay Area.

The classes will cost \$35 per person (check or cash) for the whole series of 5 classes. Bring a rod, with a matching reel and line. Add a 9 foot leader in 3X or 4X size and we will supply the fluff (no hooks are allowed). Reservations are not needed, so just show up. Please show up at least 5 to 10 minutes early for each class to allow time to set up your gear. All classes will begin promptly at 6 PM. In case of rain determination of cancelling the class will be made depending on conditions at the venue regardless of conditions elsewhere.

Important: Since the instruction uses a step by step approach, with each step building on the next, please show up to each class. If you miss a class we will not be able to take time away from the other students to catch you up on what was missed during the previous class. Beginning students will find it difficult to proceed successfully if they miss a class.

Fly Casting Classes - Open Casting Sessions

Once the 2011 Spring Fly Casting Classes are over we will hold open casting every Tuesday evening from 6 PM until 8 PM. Sessions begin May 31, 2011 and will run through September 13. Open casting is an opportunity to get more practice or work on individual casting issues with professional level individual instruction. There is no charge for the open casting.

This allows the instructors to work with advanced beginners and intermediate casters without taking extended periods of time to go through the basics with beginners.

Double-handed Casting Instruction (Spey Casting)

Guy Manning will be presenting a 4 session Double Handed Casting Clinic this Spring. Also known as Spey Casting, Double Handed casting is an extremely effective way to cover a large amount of water and get the fly to the fish effectively. The class is free to members of the STFF and Mayflies. The cost for nonmembers is \$50 for all 4 classes, payable in cash or check at the first class. The class will be limited to 6 students on a first come first served basis.

Fish Camp Scholarship Application

The Shasta Trinity Fly Fishers and the Shasta Mayflies, two local fly fishing clubs in Northern California, are offering up to six Fish Camp Scholarships to interested youth from Shasta, Trinity, Tehama, and Siskiyou Counties. Each \$750 award covers the entire cost of the five day program put on by The Fly Shop of Redding, including accommodations, meals, and use of the finest in fly fishing equipment. Campers are responsible only for clothing, a sleeping bag, and transportation to and from Fish Camp. The camp teaches fly fishing and other outdoor skills in a safe and friendly environment, and is held on a private ranch outside of Weed at the base of Mt. Shasta.

To apply for one of the scholarships, interested youth ages 10 through 15 who reside in one of the counties named above must complete this application form **and** attach two short essays answering the questions listed below. Participants may also be asked to attend a meeting of one of the sponsoring fishing clubs to give a short presentation on their experience at camp.

Applications **must be postmarked on or before April 1, 2011**. Winners will be selected by April 15, 2011, along with two alternates. All decisions will be final.


