Meeting Site: For those interested we will caravan to the lake from the "My-T-Fine Market" parking lot, Hwy. 299 & Deschutes Rd. We will depart PROMPTLY at 7:30 am.

Equipment: 4-6 wt rods, floating and/or intermediate sinking lines with 4-5 X leader

Flies: Your usual lake midges, nymphs and emergers in small sizes will work as will bugger & leach patterns size 6-12. BWO size 18, ParaAdams size 16-20. Please check with THE FLY SHOP for the latest hatch data.

Other Equipment: Float tubes, prams (no gas motors, elect. ok), pontoon boats, waders. Bank fishing is difficult because of the mud and weeds, but doable.

A Lakeshore presentation on how to catch'em will be presented by a local expert(s).

The Coffee and Donut bar will be open at the lakeshore.

Lunch: On your own. The club will provide desert around 1:30 pm. Please bring your own drinks and plenty of water.

MANZANITA LAKE FISHOUT

Thursday, September 29th

Meet at the boat launch area at 9:00 am. Be prepared for any kind of weather, Manzanita Lake is 6,000 feet in altitude. There is a ten-dollar vehicle fee for entrance to the park unless you have a senior pass.

4-6 weight rods, floating or intermediate line. 9 to 15 foot leaders to 5X. You can fish the lake from a float tube, pontoon boat, or pram no motors are allowed.

Wading the lake can be productive. Some of the best fishing can be had walking the shore and looking for cruising fish, be stealthy, hide behind a tree, and toss out a beetle or ant pattern. Be aware of the regulations here. They are posted at the picnic area on the east side of the lake. There is no fishing within 150 feet of the various mouths of Manzanita Creek. The creek is located on the east side of the lake to the north of the picnic area behind the bird nesting area.

Productive flies include:

Brown Olive Jay Fair wiggle tail. Callebatis Nymphs, Dry Flies sizes 16-18, Damsel Nymphs size 14 Baby Rainbow Trout streamer size 6, Ants and beetles are always around

Midges are my go-to flies here. Black Zebra Chironomids size 18-20, fished with a little weight under an indicator and a good dry adult midge, like an Adams, in sizes 18-20. A two fly rig seems to work best.

Coffee and donuts will be available at the boat launch. Bring a lunch and drinks for the day.

Upper Sac Fishout Report Craig Nielson - Fishmaster

On a July 26th morning about sixteen members gathered at the **Ted Fay Flyshop** in Dunsmuir for a Fishout on the Upper Sacramento River after about half of us had breakfast at the Mount Shasta Pastry Shop. After a prolonged wet spring, flows had finally dropped and the weather had turned warm. While the warm weather made the fishing pleasant, the catching slowed a bit as hatches became compressed into the early and late hours of the day.

Local guide **Craig Nielsen** provided a brief presentation on access points, rigging and strategies for the day after which members headed off to sample forty miles of freestones to try their luck. As usual some had more than others.

Lee Maxwell reported fishing with **Rick** downstream from Castle Crags nymphing with a #14 PT and #16 Fox Pupa dropper. He hooked a couple medium sized fish and caught 3 small ones. They then headed to Soda Creek only to have a couple kids jump from the bridge to cannon ball the pool they were about to fish, so they headed to Simms only to encounter some mermaids swimming topless which inspired him to switch to a #14 Stimi with a #20 Micromay dropper, catching a few fish on the dropper. He fished a #18 Elk Hair Caddis and caught several small fish in the evening only seeing a few bigger fish rising.

Ron Saiki explored the Castella Stretch around the picnic area followed by a trip to Prospect Avenue. He fished from about 10-4 with a break for lunch. He reports hooking 12 with 8 to hand including a couple nice fish in the 15-16" range. He nymphed faster water with a Copper John and brown Hogan's S&M with the bigger fish coming on the S&M.

Gerald Nelson and **Kurt Mitchell** fished below the first trestle at Cantara down to the second trestle. He landed three fish on a Micromayfly while high sticking. Kurt landed a few but they both reported losing a number of flies and a few fish in runs that have typically produced well. Kurt headed home at 3 after which Gerald headed to Ney Springs where he promptly landed a fish on a Trigger Birdsnest before switching to a dry after observing some rises. He reports never having caught a fish at Ney on a dry but on this occasion at least got a look on a Sulphur Dun.

Parker Pollock reports fishing down from Flume Creek from 10:30 to 12:30 catching a 12"er on a rubber legs. He didn't try any others and reports not covering much water.

Ross Morrison fished with **Jim Murphy** for about four hours at Conant and upstream from Simms. They saw other autos but had the stream to themselves. He reports Jim catching about 8 fish with a couple nice ones, while he landed two, including a hard fighting 16" on a fly he purchased that morning, one of Bob Grace's soft hackle P.T.'s. with Jim's coming on a Prince Nymph. They left "tired and happy".

Kevin Kay fished with friends Travis and Jordon at Conant west. They fished downstream past Flume Creek. Kevin reports catching three nice fish nymphing with a tan Fox Poopah and red Copper John. After a dry spell he caught three more on an Iron Sally. Travis and Jordon were not as lucky.

Dick Recchia and **Creighton Smith** joined Fishmaster Craig Nielsen to host new members and fly fishers **Nancy** and **Alan** at Cantara. Alan managed to catch his first Upper Sac fish on a fly nymphing with a beadhead PT while Nancy hooked several but was not able to bring one to hand. Both learned to fish dry dropper rigs as well as indicator fishing with and without indicators. Alan also swung a streamer. Creighton found a few fish while Dick, always the good host, opted to fish the less productive parts of runs, leaving the prime water for the others and went home skunked but happy. Nancy later went to the Dunsmuir City Park solo and landed her first trout on a fly!



There will be lots of buyers looking for gear; so start now to sort out your fly-fishing gear so you can participate in this once a year event.


