Meeting Time and Place: 8:30 Public Gardens at Court St./Diestlehorst Bridge

Please remember to purchase your 2010 Fishing License.

Fishing Location: The upper reaches of the Lower Sacramento River, (depending on river conditions).

Equipment/Tackle: Most folk's rod preference is a 6 or 7 wt. Tippet sizes from 3X to 4X. Sometimes tippet down to 5X, for really low, clear water or dry flies. Many use Fluorocarbon tippet for clear water conditions. Plan on bringing your favorite indicator and 3X tapered leaders or 12lb Fluorocarbon to build a nymphing leader.

Angling Methods: With winter conditions and hopefully reasonably low flows, the most productive method will likely be nymph fishing under indicators.

Flies: #10-12 egg patterns (shrimp pink or orange for colored water and darker conditions to champagne for clearer water and lighter conditions), Alevin patterns #8-12, #6-8 Superfloss Rubberlegs, #12-14 copper johns (copper, chartreuse and red), and #14-18 flashback PTs, Micromays and other favorite BWO nymph patterns. Toss in a few midges such as Zebras and Crystal midges #16-20. I always keep a few caddis patterns such as tan Fox Pupas or Birdsnests in the box for those sunny warm afternoons when they sometimes pop. For dries, bring your favorite BWO dries and emergers and keep your fingers crossed.

SMITH RIVER STEELHEAD FISHOUT - MARCH 6, 7, 8 - 2012

The Smith River is the last main river in California without any dams. The giant race of steelhead found here are some of the biggest to be found anywhere south of Canada or maybe in a very few rivers in Washington and Idaho.

I was asked to put a trip together for Shasta Trinity Fly Fishers, during the late winter months. I picked March because that is when the weather is, maybe at its best; never a sure thing on the coastal rivers. Check your calendars or make a note of the event. This date will be finalized dependent on weather, water levels, etc. **This Fishout is open to all club members**

Being as it may, we are going to give it a try and you have the chance of hooking that steelhead of a lifetime.

You may find some fish shallow, but most will be deep 6' - 15', slower water.

Sugar Creek Ranch is located at the confluence of Sugar Creek and the Scott River in the Scott Valley of Northern California's Siskiyou County. The year-round spring water flowing through the ponds originates in the Trinity Alps and the Salmon Mountains. The "gin-clear" water and abundant natural food allow us to offer the *HOTTEST_*rainbow trout fly-fishing you will ever experience. Private water & Very Big Fish! The normal daily rod fee is \$165.

STFF's special rate for this Fishout is \$75 - Limit for this event is 10 fly fishers...with only 3 more spots available.

Directions from Redding: I-5 North to 1st Yreka exit, "Fort Jones-Trinity Center-Hwy 3". Take Highway 3 south through the towns of Ft. Jones, Greenview and Etna.

• Approx. 10 mi. south of Etna, on the east side of Hwy 3 and immediately south of the "Moore's Gravel" sign is the North Pond entrance.

• The Middle Ponds and Lodge access road is .9 miles south of the north pond entrance, turn left (east) at the sign that says "9814 S. Hwy 3". If you cross the bridge over Sugar Creek, you have gone too far. At the first fork, go left and uphill to reach the lodge, or straight to reach the Middle Ponds.

• The South Pond and Office entrance is .15 mile further south on the east side of Hwy 3 and immediately south of the Sugar Creek Bridge at the large white machine shop.

Fall River at Spinnerfall Lodge

We have arranged two dates again this year for the Fall River Fishout. We are currently fully booked on June 25-27 and have four rooms left for June 27-29. Pricing for the rooms are based on double occupancy and include breakfast and tax.

The price for two days and two nights lodging w/ breakfast is \$130.00 per person per <u>double occupancy</u> tax included. <u>Checks are to be made out to STFF and should be paid no later than the March meeting</u> as this will give us time to pay for the rooms and secure our dates. Individuals will be responsible for paying their own boat rentals, guides and dinners.

Trip one: Arrive anytime on the 25th to either launch your boat or pick up your rental boat. I will have prearranged with Cody and Tanya to have rental boats shuttled to Circle 7 if they cannot be taken out of Spinnerfall. You can fish until your rooms are ready or until dinner. We will meet at 5:30 for cocktails and dinner at the Lodge's restaurant. The 26th and 27th are open with no other scheduled get together planned. This is the season of the Hex hatch and as such many will want to participate in the evening frenzy.

Trip two: Arrive anytime on the 27th to either launch your boat or pick up your rental boat. I will have pre arranged with Cody and Tanya to have rental boats shuttled to Circle 7 if they are not able to be taken out of Spinnerfall. You can fish until your rooms are ready or until dinner. We will meet at 5:30 for cocktails and dinner at the Lodge's restaurant. The 28th and 29th are open with no other scheduled get together planned. This is the season of the Hex and as such many will want to participate in the frenzy.

The Fall River can only be accessed by boat so The Lodge offers boat rental with 4 hp motors which again we have negotiated a special price of \$80.00/day, last year's rate. The Lodge also offers guide service as well, we did not negotiate a special rate for the guides but they are available for:

Full Day - \$400.00 Half Day - \$250.00 Evening Hex - \$150.00 - Guide service includes boats.

We have also negotiated the use of their boat ramp for no charge if you have your own boat and are a guest at the Lodge.

For the past fourteen years, The Fly Shop in Redding has run a youth Fish Camp, currently being held at its private preserve, Antelope Creek Ranch, near Weed. The experienced pros at this camp teach youth various casting techniques, how to select and tie on artificial flies, how to read the waters, and how to land and safely release the fish they catch. 

We will of course not be charging for this event and it will include lunch for all attendees and vendors.


We hope to have an even bigger turn out this year and will be inviting other vendors. There will be some minor changes made to the format and vendor area which should improve the event for all.


