You may find some fish shallow, but most will be deep 6' - 15', slower water.

Place: Carpoolers meet at Sunset Market (corner of Buenaventura and Eureka) in time to depart promptly at 0730 hours. Meeting location is Mountain Valley Grill parking lot, Lewiston. (MVG may be closed, if so, coffee and donuts will be served at 8:10.) Please call ahead 778-3717 if you plan to eat breakfast there. Lunch is on your own.

Directions: From Hwy 299, turn right on Lewiston Dam Blvd. Drive 4 miles to Lewiston. Drive past the Plug-n-Jug and turn left into the parking lot by the gas station and mini-mart. We will caravan to the river access.

Target species: Steelhead. Salmon & Steelhead smolts and Brown Trout are also in the river.

Recommended gear: 2 wt-6 wt rod, floating and or sink-tip line, 2-4X tippet.

Flies: Your favorite Steelhead flies along with Egg patterns, Golden and Black Stonefly nymphs, Copper John, P.T., Bird's Nest, San Juan Worm, olive, black Leach patterns, BWO, Adams, Adult Caddis, Callibaetis mayflies, March Brown. Please call Trinity Fly Shop (623-6757) for the latest hatch information and productive flies.

Fishing method: Swing, indicator, short line and downstream nymphing are all effective.

Note: *This is a mandatory catch and release, barbless hooks, fly-fishing only area.* Please take great care releasing all fish. When possible, keep them in the water during your release. You will need a Steelhead Fishing Report Card along with your License. Wading is low, slow and easy, but bring your wading staff.

Special STFF Fishout: Sugar Creek Ranch Saturday-March 24th

Sugar Creek Ranch is located at the confluence of Sugar Creek and the Scott River in the Scott Valley of Northern California's Siskiyou County. The year-round spring water flowing through the ponds originates in the Trinity Alps and the Salmon Mountains. The "gin-clear" water and abundant natural food allow us to offer the *HOTTEST_*rainbow trout fly-fishing you will ever experience. Private water & Very Big Fish! The normal daily rod fee is \$165.

STFF's special rate for this Fishout is \$75 - Limit for this event is 10 fly fishers...with only 3 more spots available.

Directions from Redding: I-5 North to 1st Yreka exit, "Fort Jones-Trinity Center-Hwy 3". Take Highway 3 south through the towns of Ft. Jones, Greenview and Etna.

- Approx. 10 mi. south of Etna, on the east side of Hwy 3 and immediately south of the "Moore's Gravel" sign is the North Pond entrance.
- The Middle Ponds and Lodge access road is .9 miles south of the north pond entrance, turn left (east) at the sign that says "9814 S. Hwy 3". If you cross the bridge over Sugar Creek, you have gone too far. At the first fork, go left and uphill to reach the lodge, or straight to reach the Middle Ponds.
- The South Pond and Office entrance is .15 mile further south on the east side of Hwy 3 and immediately south of the Sugar Creek Bridge at the large white machine shop.

Fall River at Spinnerfall Lodge

We have arranged two dates again this year for the Fall River Fishout. We are currently fully booked on June 25-27 and have four rooms left for June 27-29. Pricing for the rooms are based on double occupancy and include breakfast and tax.

The price for two days and two nights lodging w/ breakfast is \$130.00 per person per double occupancy tax included. Trip two: Arrive anytime on the 27th to either launch your boat or pick up your rental boat. I will have pre arranged with Cody and Tanya to have rental boats shuttled to Circle 7 if they are not able to be taken out of Spinnerfall. You can fish until your rooms are ready or until dinner. We will meet at 5:30 for cocktails and dinner at the Lodge's restaurant. The 28th and 29th are open with no other scheduled get together planned. The Fall River can only be accessed by boat so The Lodge offers boat rental with 4 hp motors which again we have negotiated a special price of \$80.00/day, last year's rate. The Lodge also offers guide service as well, we did not negotiate a special rate for the guides but they are available for:

Full Day - \$400.00 Half Day - \$250.00 Evening Hex - \$150.00 - Guide service includes boats.
