Directions: From Hwy 273, take Clear Creek Road, drive 4.7 miles to turn off on left side of Clear Creek Road. Look for "Clear Creek Gorge Trail" sign just before turnoff.

Target species: Rainbow Trout - beautiful, wild, fat and feisty

Recommended Equipment: 4 to 6 wt rods; floating lines with indicators or dry flies; 7 to 9 Ft leaders with 3X to 6X tippet; Insect & Tick Repellent.

Flies: May flies and stone flies seem to be the food of choice. Gold bead poxy-back Golden Stone #10; Superfloss rubber leg brown body olive legs #6; "Little Yellow" Sally #14; Rouge Foam Stone salmon fly #4; Foam Golden Stone #8; Quigley's Stacker #16; Mercer's Poxy-back PMD #16 or #18; GB Flashback Pt #16 or #18; PMD Quigley Sparkle Stacker #16; PMD Challenged #16.

The above flies were recommended by Mike Mercer and are available at "The Fly Shop". Many other flies will also work.

Food: A stream side buffet will be served at 4:45 PM. Please bring your favorite beverage. Come early to enjoy the fellowship, food and suit up. We will try to be on the water by 5:30 PM and fish until dark.

Maps: Maps with river access points will be available at the "How to Catchem Talk" right after dinner.

This fishout is highly experimental since I do not know of STFF ever doing Lake Britton. To cover the lake a boat would be necessary, but because we will be concentrating on the inlet of Pit 1 and Hat Creek all watercraft should work, i.e., pontoons, float tubes, kayaks, canoes. Our target species will be whatever bites; this could be panfish, smallmouth bass, pike minnows, trout or crappie.

Time: 7:00 AM at the café, 8:45 AM at the intersection of Hwy 299 & 89.

Meeting Place: We will meet at The Station Café in Montgomery Creek. After breakfast we will caravan to the put in site. Those not able to meet at The Station Café (if you are coming from Shingletown) can meet at Four Corners intersection of Hwy 299 & 89 at 8:45 AM. Those wanting to launch boats will travel to Jamo Point Boat Launch (\$7.00 launch fee); those with pontoon boats and float tubes will travel to a PG&E access road east of the Pit 1 Bridge to access the water.

Equipment: 3-5 weight rods, floating or intermediate sinking lines. Any size tippet should work, size the tippet to your flies.

Flies: Bring an arsenal of bass flies, trout flies, panfish flies; anything that you think will work. Remember, this is experimental, so we can all get creative.

2012 Fish Camp Scholarship Winners Announced

The Fish Camp Scholarship Committee is pleased to announce that STFF and the Shasta Mayflies have awarded a total of six full scholarships to Fish Camp 2012, four of which were funded by STFF and two by the Shasta Mayflies. Three alternates were also selected. The committee was pleased to read all of the well written essays on why the applicants wanted to go to Fish Camp and why they are interested in fly fishing. The following are excerpts from the essays written by this year's six winners:

Joshua Grove, a 10 year old boy from Redding, wrote:

"Fly fishing interests me because I have been trying to fly fish all my life. I have been practicing a lot at home. I look at books, magazines, and television to look at better techniques. The more I learn from people that fly fish a lot will make me the best fly fisherman or kid. So, please pick me for your Scholarship. I would be absolutely thankful if I was picked to go."

Evan Funk, a 10 year old boy from Palo Cedro, wrote:

"I have tried to fly fish a couple of times and it is very challenging. Some things I know about fly fishing are that you don't want to be around a lot of trees and you need to be careful when someone is behind you. I also know that the fly line is thicker than a spinning rod line and is used as the weight to cast. I know it will be fun to study the different kinds of bugs that the fish eat so I can make the right kind of fly to use."

Christian Harrington, an 11 year old boy from Cottonwood, wrote:

"I enjoy the beautiful places fishing takes us. I also saw the fly fishing exhibit at Turtle Bay, which made me like it even more. Above all, I would love to spend a week with kids my age, and have fun learning to fish! It would also be an awesome thing to know a calming, relaxing sport that I can do until I'm an old man."

Tyrail Huey, a 14 year old boy from Redding, wrote:

"Anyone that knows me will tell you that I live and breathe fishing. Really I do. That is why this is a great camp for me. This fly fishing camp scholarship would be a dream come true. For me it is a learning opportunity and a chance for advancement for my mind and brain. It is a recreational activity that requires and promotes motor skills. Fly fishing will help me to stay out of trouble and helps me to stay away from the wrong people. Fly fishing also teaches me skills that I can use in public, like how to slow down and enjoy life and not rush all the time."

Ashton Smith, a 12 year old boy from Red Bluff, wrote:

"I have always loved fishing. My scout leader took me on a fly-fishing trip, and I would like to extend my knowledge on the subject of fly fishing. I want to learn what flies the fish would respond to at different times of the year and know how to tie them. When I learn how to fly fish, my grandpa and I can enjoy fly fishing together and create memories. Fish Camp would help me be able to introduce fly fishing and the importance of catch and release to my brothers and my fellow scouts."

Robert Ford, a 13 year old boy from Redding, wrote:

"While changing channels on TV one day, I came across a fishing show and they demonstrated fly fishing. It was interesting to me because you are so much more involved and active than cast fishing. To me, it is like a science in that you are always trying to figure out different combinations of flies, the flow of the water, type of fish, what they are hitting, etc. I like trying to outsmart the fish and I love the thrill of having one on the line and not knowing exactly what you have on the end of your line. I also love the outdoors with the smells and sounds that are around lakes and rivers."

The Mayflies enjoyed a meeting with Tips and Techniques given for their outing on April 13th on the Trinity River. Realizing that we have quite a number of novice fly fishers, we're going to continue to try to provide some educational tips and techniques at each meeting, and will depend on some of our more experienced Mayflies to assist with that. The Mayflies will assist with a Casting for Recovery fundraiser in September, and a committee was put together with Marcia Caranci, Kathie Burns, and Cris Rohn Hartman to help other STFF members in the planning.

Double-handed Casting Instruction

(Spey Casting)

Guy Manning will be presenting a 4 session Double Handed Casting Clinic this Spring. Also known as Spey Casting, Double Handed casting is an extremely effective way to cover a large amount of water and get the fly to the fish effectively.
