- * **Time & Place:** Meet at 8:30 AM at the Jones Valley public boat launch. Launch your boat and meet at the bottom of launch ramp for Coffee & Doughnuts and a briefing where to fish.
- * Lunch: Bring your own lunch and we will all meet at Arbuckle Flat Camp Ground at 12:30 for the lunch break and swap fish tales.
- Equipment: 5 to 8 weight rods, floating lines will work but sinking lines are preferred.
 Tapered Leaders 9 10 feet for floating lines and Level leaders (8 10lb test) 5 6 feet for sinking lines.
- Flies: Streamer patterns in sizes #2 #1 (Clouser style flies, Deceivers, Bunny Leeches, Wooly Buggers, Crawdads, and any pattern representing threadfin shad). Best colors would be Chartreuse and White, Black, Olive, Orange, and Red. Note: Blue Huchies, rubber worms in assorted colors, or garden hackle using spinning gear will also work.
- * Other Equipment: polarized sun glasses a must, hat, sunscreen, water are recommended for safe and healthy day on the lake. *Do not forget to bring your PFD.*

This is a boat necessary fish out. Those with boats please advise if you have room for a member without a boat. Non-boat owners please advise if you need to pair up with another club member. Double-Handed Casting Instruction (Spey Casting)

Guy Manning will be presenting a four session Double-Handed Casting Clinic this Summer. Also known as Spey Casting, Double-Handed casting is an extremely effective way to cover a large amount of water and get the fly to the fish. The cost is \$50 for all four classes, payable in cash or check at the first class. The class will be limited to six students on a first come, first served basis.

This class will cover the following:

- A short history of Double-Handed Casting
- The differences between Spey, Skagit, and Scandi rods and lines
- Fishing methods used with each technology
- Double Handed Casting Terminology
- Discussion of river right and river left and the casts used in each situation
- Basic body and rod positions
- Motions of a simple DH cast
- Switch cast
- Snap-C cast
- Double Spey cast
- Single Spey cast
- Snake Roll cast

Classes will be held on Saturday mornings from 9:30 AM until 12:00 noon, on June 22, 29, July 13 and 20, 2013. The first two classes will be held on the lawn south of the convention center in the Turtle Bay complex, across from the Channel 7 Studios. The last class will be on the water at a location to be decided, probably the barge hole. Please show up about 10 minutes early for each session so you have time to set up your gear prior to the start of class.

What to bring: Rod, Reel, Line, leader, hat and protective glasses. No hooks are allowed. A yarn fly will be provided. You will need to make a grass leader for the second and third session. Instructions on making grass leaders will be given during the first class. For the last two classes you will want wading gear.

Important: If you don't have glasses you will not be allowed to cast.
